Pocahontas Kairos #21 / April 11-14, 2024

As usual, the men entered the gym at Pocahontas State Correction Center on Thursday very reserved and apprehensive. However, it didn't take long for the mood to change and the atmosphere to begin to shift. The program began with introductions and the forming of what we refer to as, families. We form 7 families that consist of 6 inmates and 3 volunteers. The families have biblical names, Peter, Paul, Matthew, Luke, John, Mark, and James.

After the tables are settled, we begin a series of short talks which begin to introduce and build upon the Gospel and lead towards the benefit of forgiveness. There are 10 of these talks and time after each one for discussion, interaction, and personal reflection. It is amazing to watch how the participants change over the course of the 4 days we are with them. No one can come away without truly being overwhelmed by the love of God that permeates the room.

The program culminates in the forgiveness ceremony which takes place on Saturday evening. The men are able to unload burdens of unforgiveness and shame. You can literally watch the weight being lifted from their backs.

Sunday morning is a time of celebration and encouragement. The last few talks begin to focus on how to live a Godly Christian life in their days ahead. We also spend time encouraging them to get involved in the inside Church and to plug into ongoing Bible study and prayer groups.

During Kairos #21 we saw God touch men's hearts in remarkable ways. It is impossible to tell what mysterious things He did in every man's heart but I am confident no one left in the same condition in which he arrived.

At the end of the program, we ask the participants a series of 3 questions. 1.In what spiritual condition did you arrive when you came to Kairos?

Some answers we received: Torn, conflicted, lost, broken, chaos, beaten to spiritual exhaustion, wanting to grow, wanting to connect, had all talk and no walk, an unpolished stone, needing to learn, sad, in shambles, frustrated and drained.

2. What did you find here?

GOD'S SPECIAL TIME

Some answers we received: Closure, family, community, eagerness, wanting, enlightenment, compassion, friendship, gratitude, forgiveness, insight, acceptance, love, no judgement, renewal, knowledge, fellowship.

3. What are you taking with you when you leave?

Love, joy, the will of God being done, acceptance, closure, clarity, energy to combat spiritual exhaustion, forgiveness, gratitude, leaving behind extra baggage, better understanding, better tools, memories, courage to be a real Christian, renewed outlook, fellowship, friendship, an extra 5 pounds.

Some short recap of some of the stories we heard:

J. said he had been Muslim for 20 years and previously a Christian but had never experienced the love of God and others like during these 4 days. Came to realize faith without works id dead.

C. said it was a miracle that he attended the weekend. He did drugs, he sold drugs and he was a thief, but had found the Lord. Previously he said he was a dead shell, but now wants to use his story to tell others of his experience of forgiveness and love.

L. said he was a devout Muslim but felt broken, destroyed, suicidal, and just didn't care about anything, still struggling with pain and addiction but felt changed. (I watched as he completed the forgiveness ceremony he wept tears of brokenness, went across the gym, leaned against the wall and sank to the floor. One of the elders from the inside church went to him and embraced him as they both wept together.)

S. spoke of Galatians 2:20, how we should bear one another burden and fulfill the law of Christ.

D. said he was struggling with depression, fear, and feelings of worthlessness. He had thoughts of suicide, he had overdosed and did not feel he was loved, but had found that he was loved by God.

D. said his mom had died 5 months ago and confessed that he had tried to kill himself.

T. said he wanted to celebrate Jesus because of the overwhelming love and fellowship he had received.

Another young man told of his estrangement from his father while he was growing up and how he had grown to hate him. He said that because of his incarceration they had been able to reconcile and forgive one another and he encouraged not to give up on broken

relationships because God is able to heal them

I had two men in my family that both said they did not know why they were there. D. had just transferred in to Pocahontas and did not want to be there. He has already requested to transfer somewhere else. He told me that one evening someone slipped an invitation under his cell door. He decided to come and see. He told me that he had never experienced anything like it and knows that no matter where he goes, he has got to trust and follow Jesus. The first day G. told me someone had tricked him by putting his name on the list but he decided to come just to see what it was about. He then said "I probably won't be back tomorrow." He came back all 4 days and I watch as God broke through and literally pierce his stony heart. He listened intently to all the talks and took it all in. He confessed to me at one point he was a Buddhist, but at the end when we were asking what will you take back with you, he said "Jesus." I'm not sure he got quite all the way there but I know that God touched G. deeply with His love.

These are just a few of the stories. I know there are many more and some we will never know until we get to heaven. I want to say THANK YOU!!!! For all your prayers and cookies. You are just as much a part of this ministry as those of us who go inside. We could not do it without you. Thank you, thank you, thank you, and may God bless you. Bill Rich





Treasurer's Report

Below is the financial report for March 2024. God continues to bless us with faithful givers. God is good, all the time!!

I want to let everyone know how the roof capital campaign project is progressing. We have a estimate of approximately \$55,000 that will be required to do the work over the education wing and over the entrance to Bethany Hall. As of this writing, we have amassed approximately \$45,000 of the funds necessary to complete this project with some additional pledges to come in. Along with approximately \$10,000 of savings, we are moving forward to have the project begin soon. So, we will still need some "ROOF" money, but to replace the savings we are using to complete the entire need. I am so grateful to our God for His provision to His people and your generosity. We are not quite there yet, so I am asking everyone to continue to PRAY that this need will soon be met, and that God will show us the "next thing" He desires for us to tackle with His help.

E-GIVING UPDATE: We are evaluating our online giving portal. There has been limited usage of the portal, and just recently we have been made aware of additional security testing that will be required to keep the product. I would like to hear from those of you that have used the online portal, primarily to let me know what impact the elimination of this portal would mean to your ability to contribute to the church. Alternatively, if there is anyone out there that would be willing to perform security testing for our system on a quarterly basis, please let me know.

As a reminder, please continue to check for LIGHTS, RUNNING TOILETS, A/C OR HEAT, etc. following all meetings at the church. Don't assume someone else will lock up or turn off. Also, if you become aware of maintenance issues with the property, please bring it to the attention of the Property Ministry Team or the church office. Thanks to Scott, Allen, George and all the rest of the guys who selflessly give their time to keep our facilities in great condition!!! Our Church is truly blessed!


